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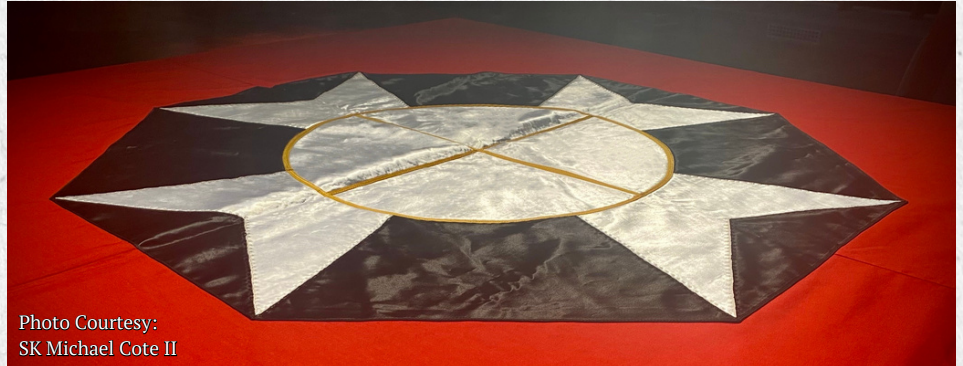

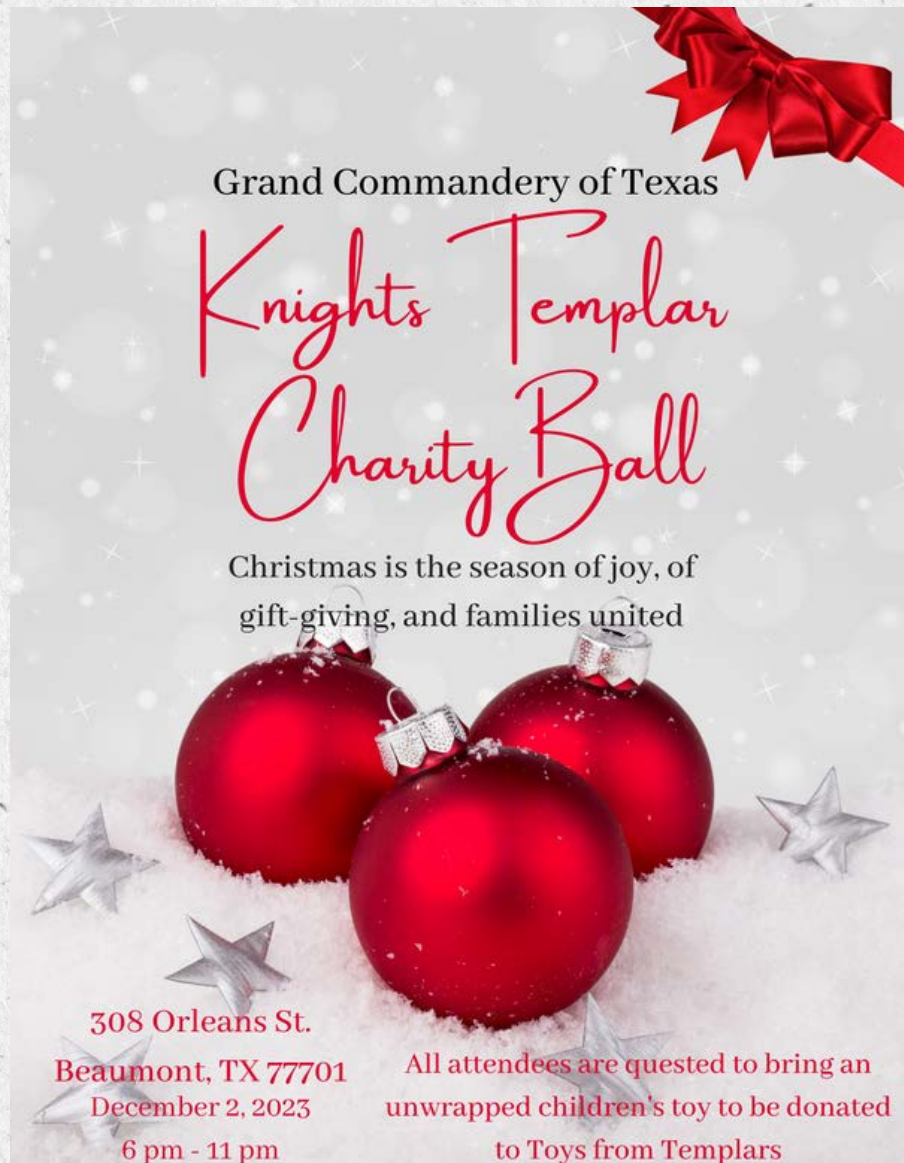
The items listed on this flyer are recommended and very inexpensive donations, but it will require your time in service to others.
