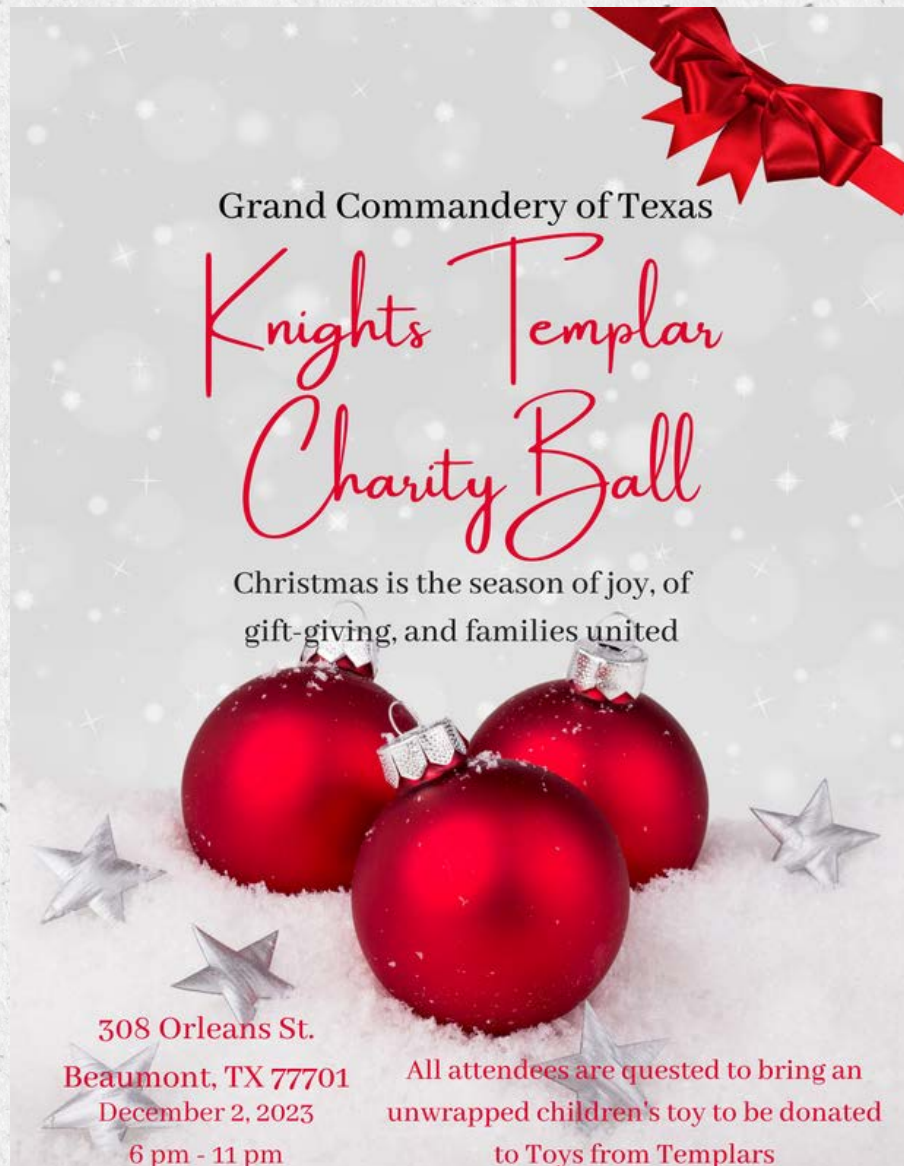

A MESSAGE FROM THE EMINENT GRAND PRELATE

Are you thankful no matter what?

After a long hot summer, we are finally receiving some cool fall weather. For that, I am thankful. We are all making plans for the Thanksgiving Day Holiday. Cleaning the house and planning the meal for guests and family. Or, maybe just planning a party for the big ballgame. I am sure we all will be giving thanks November 23rd for the blessings God has given us, for family and friends, and the wonderful meal set before us. It is easy to give thanks for most people on this one day each year. It is easy to give thanks when things are going well. We are told there are some benefits of giving thanks. Gratitude can help us see the beauty in ordinary things. Being thankful can remind us of the blessings we receive, both big and small. Gratitude can help people feel more positive emotions, deal with adversity, and build strong relationships. Expressing gratitude can bring a calm sense of well-being. But what about those times when things aren't going well. When things are so bad you just don't know which way to turn next. The Bible tells us of a man who had every right to be bitter - but wasn't. He was languishing almost forgotten in a harsh Roman prison. His only bed was the hard, cold stone floor, while chained. Separated from friends, unjustly accused, brutally treated. But instead of complaints, his lips rang with words of praise and thanksgiving!
