## 2020-2021 TEXAS SUPPLEMENT

Greetings, Sir Knights, and Happy New Year! With the major holiday season at an end, and viable vaccines potentially on the way in the near future, we should theoretically see another, and hopefully final, downward trend in the COVID curve.
